

Course Overview

Designed for family child care educators to learn the fundamentals of running a family child care business, this interactive learning experience provides 34 hours of professional development over 10 weeks and allows participants to do a deep dive into content while building supportive relationships with each other. It is currently available in English, Spanish, and Chinese.

1	Q) <u>8</u> <u>8</u>	Introduction to FCC Business Participants learn about the Business Series, develop a personal goal for their participation, and meet in small "learning lab" groups for the first time.
2	A:	Marketing Your FCC Business Participants define what is unique about their businesses, explore creative marketing ideas, and write and role-play a sales pitch.
3	Januar I	FCC Contracts Participants evaluate the importance of various contract terms and practice communicating effectively about the contract to clients.
4		Policy Handbook & Partnerships Participants define the unique value of a policy handbook, practice writing policies, and identify key strategies for partnering with families.
5		Risk Management & Emergency Preparedness Participants examine how a risk management plan mitigates common risks to running a child care program and evaluate the critical elements of business insurance.
6	(n)	Time-Space Percentage Participants discuss the meaning and purpose of Time-Space Percentage (T-S%) and calculate a sample T-S% using AOK's online calculator.
7	(\$)	Income & Expense Record Keeping Participants identify and categorize common income and expenses and practice entering financial information into an accounting system.
8		Budgeting & Savings Participants learn to interpret a cash flow report, project income and expenses into a budget, and analyze the most common barriers to building savings.
9		Preparing for Taxes Participants generate creative ideas for organized record keeping, role-play interviewing a qualified tax preparer, and review the series content through a Jeopardy-style game.
10		Graduation Participants share and reflect about their experience (family and friends are invited to join the celebration of the class's achievement).
